- **Earn a stipend while attending classes. Tuition and books are paid.**
- **Minimum requirements include: High school diploma or GED, stable job history, clear background check, Florida residency and commitment to work for MPMHC.**
- **Each program has specific school requirements.**
- **Each program has specific work requirements during and after the program.**

Nursing Assistant: Oct 11, 2010; 2011 classes TBA. The Nursing Assistant assists our nursing staff to provide for our patients' basic needs. Some basic skills include: bathing, bed making, assisting the patient walk/move, feeding and taking vital signs. This is an entry-level patient care position. Opportunity for advancement to Patient Care Technician. Education is provided by Rue Education. This program lasts 5 weeks. Work commitment is 1 year post program completion. **Call the EAYL info line 462-EARN, prompt #5 for job fair info. (Updated regularly)**

Licensed Practical Nurse: 2011 classes TBA The Licensed Practical Nurse provides bedside care to our hospitalized patients. The LPN works under the supervision of a Registered Nurse. Some of the tasks include: patient assessment, advanced wound care, medication and intravenous administration. Education is provided by PTEC. This program lasts about 15 months. **There will be no job fair for this position, but please call the EAYL info lines for updates 462-EARN prompt # 5 (updated regularly).** Applicants must apply on line for job posting # 49242 (nursing assistant non-certified) - please follow the directions in the requirement section, including mandatory PTEC admissions seminar. More information can be obtained from www.myptec.org under the nursing tab. Work commitment is 3 years after LPN licensure.

Registered Nurse: Classes begin every August and January. The Registered Nurse is a professional who is responsible for coordinating patient care 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The R.N provides all aspects of nursing care, including physical, psychological and spiritual care, while remaining responsible for clinical patient outcomes. Saint Petersburg College teaches this program. Completion of this program takes an average of 2-3 years. This program requires that you meet the admission criteria of the RN program at SPC.
